

**LINUS PAULING EXHIBIT A SUCCESS

The “Linus Pauling and the Twentieth Century” exhibition concluded its five-week stay on June 10, 2001, on the campus of Soka University of America, Aliso Viejo at the Founders Hall Art Gallery.

The 2,556-square-foot traveling exhibit, which traces more than seven decades of Linus Pauling’s life and work through photographs, diaries and historic artifacts, attracted more than 5,000 people, including 3rd-, 5th- and 6th-grade students from Bergeson Elementary School in Laguna Niguel. Students also came from Dana Hills High School in Dana Point, Coastline Community College in Fountain Valley and from Mission Viejo and Capistrano Valley high schools, both in Mission Viejo.

Leading Pauling biographer Tom Hagar from the University of Oregon closed the exhibit with a special evening lecture on June 7, celebrating the legacy of Pauling and his wife, Ava Helen. This was the second event in the 2001 Soka University Speakers Series.

The next stop for the Pauling Exhibit is the Boston Science Museum in Massachusetts, for a one-year stay.
